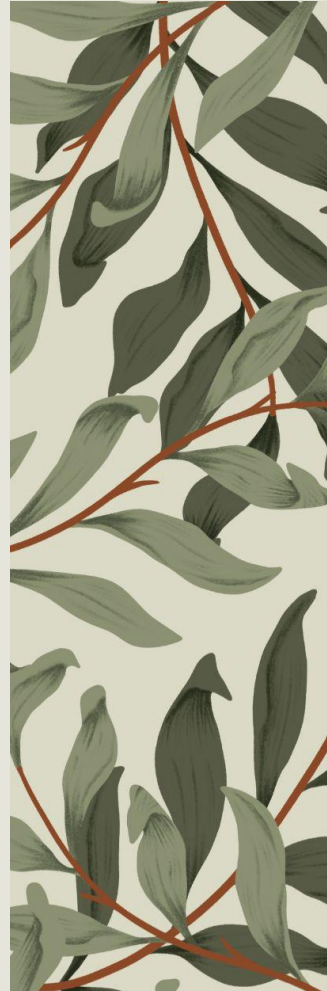

1 Then they told David, saying, "Behold, the Philistines are fighting against Keilah and are plundering the threshing floors." **2** So David inquired of the Lord, saying, "Shall I go and attack these Philistines?" And the Lord said to David, "Go and attack the Philistines and deliver Keilah." **3** But David's men said to him, "Behold, we are afraid here in Judah. How much more then if we go to Keilah against the ranks of the Philistines?" **4** Then David inquired of the Lord once more. 

7 When it was told Saul that David had come to Keilah, Saul said, "God has delivered him into my hand, for he shut himself in by entering a city with double gates and bars." **8** So Saul summoned all the people for war, to go down to Keilah to besiege David and his men. **9** Now David knew that Saul was plotting evil against him; so he said to Abiathar the priest, "Bring the ephod here." **10** Then David said, "O Lord God of Israel, Your servant has heard for certain that Saul is seeking to come to Keilah to destroy the city on my account. **11** Will the men of Keilah surrender me into his hand? Will Saul come down just as Your servant has heard? O Lord God of Israel, I pray, tell Your servant." And the Lord said, "He will come down." **12** Then David said, "Will the men of Keilah surrender me and my men into the hand of Saul?" And the Lord said, "They will surrender you."



13 Then David and his men, about six hundred, arose and departed from Keilah, and they went wherever they could go. When it was told Saul that David had escaped from Keilah, he gave up the pursuit. **14** David stayed in the wilderness in the strongholds, and remained in the hill country in the wilderness of Ziph. And Saul sought him every day, but God did not deliver him into his hand.

15 Now David became aware that Saul had come out to seek his life while David was in the wilderness of Ziph at Horesh. **16** And Jonathan, Saul's son, arose and went to David at Horesh, and encouraged him in God. **17** Thus he said to him, "Do not be afraid, because the hand of Saul my father will not find you, and you will be king over Israel and I will be next to you; and Saul my father knows that also." **18** So the two of them made a covenant before the Lord; and David stayed at Horesh while Jonathan went to his house.

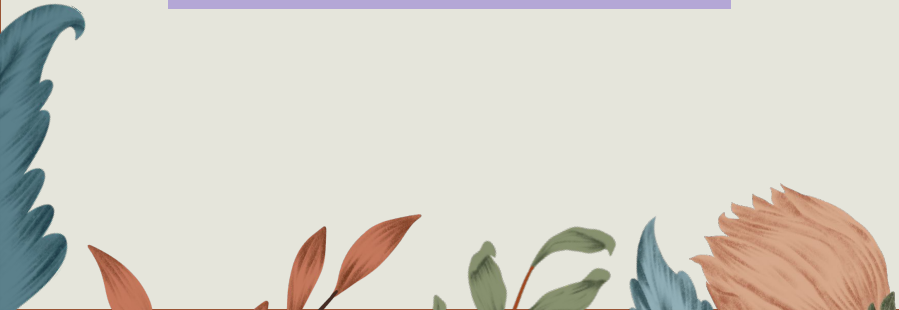



24 So they set out and went to **Ziph** ahead of Saul. Now David and his men were in the Desert of Maon, in the Arabah south of Jeshimon. **25** Saul and his men began the search, and when David was told about it, he went down to the rock and stayed in the Desert of Maon. When Saul heard this, he went into the Desert of Maon in pursuit of David.

26 Saul was going along one side of the mountain, and David and his men were on the other side, hurrying to get away from Saul. As Saul and his forces were closing in on David and his men to capture them, **27** a messenger came to Saul, saying, "**Come quickly! The Philistines are raiding the land.**" **28** Then Saul broke off his pursuit of David and went to meet the Philistines. That is why they call this place Sela Hammahlekoth. **29** And David went up from there and lived in the strongholds of **En Gedi**.

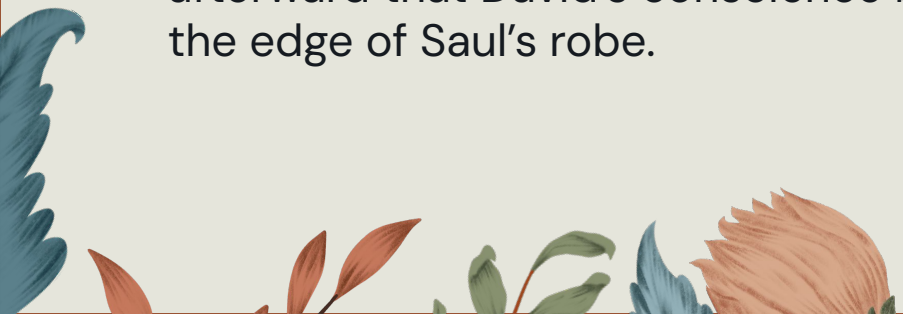

En Gedi

En Gedi is the largest oasis along the western shore of the Dead Sea. The springs here have allowed nearly continuous habitation of the site since 3500 BC. The area was allotted to the tribe of Judah, and was famous in the time of Solomon (Josh 15:62).



En Gedi

Even though there are many springs around the Dead Sea, most of them have a high salt content. En Gedi is one of only two freshwater springs located on the western shore of the Dead Sea and, because of the greater availability of land for agriculture at En Gedi, it is the best spring by which to settle.
